Shootout started the tournament against Blazer Comets with a solid 6-0 win Friday night. Saturday morning they faced Oklahoma Dynamites Badside in their strongest fought game to that point in the season but ended the game in an 0-1 loss at the bottom of the 7th. The girls faced a long road back to the top but worked hard Saturday to get there. With no break, they immediately went to face Pride and came out with an impressive 12-2 win in ITB. The girls had a short (but well deserved) one game break then shut out the Oklahoma Explosion, 8-0 and Oklahoma Rage 5-0 in back to back victories. The Lady Falcons finished second in last years state tournament. This year the girls wanted redemption for last years loss – and they got it.

The Lady Falcons won the 7th and 8th grade tournament, which was played at the Pittsburg County Softball Complex, by defeating Maryretta 9-0, Rocky Mountain 2-1 and Vion in the finals 6-0.

Taylor Dewbery pitched a no-hitter in the game against Maryetta.

In what would prove to be the toughest opponent the Lady Falcons would face in the tournament, extra innings had to be used in the game against Rocky Mountain. Both teams were held scoreless at the end of regulation play.

Lady Falcons head coach Kris Mitchell had high praise for her team.

“There are six 8th graders that have been with the team since 5th grade. They are Taylor Dewbery, McKenzie McClendon, Cheyenne Smith, Jenna Bigam, LaShonda Green and Justyce Edwards,” said Mitchell.

“These girls made it all the way to the championship last year and they knew what it felt like to get so close and lose. This year the team wanted to redeem themselves and prove to everyone how good of a team we are. These girls were highly motivated.”

The Lady Falcons had an overall season record of 34-1.

“There were only 11 players that played yesterday, but there are 21 girls on this team and two managers. They did a great job of making up cheers from our dugout and were very loud. The energy to win the game against Rocky Mountain came from the dugout,” Mitchell said. “I am so proud of our team.”
